Backbone Support

- Asking how different parts of the community are affected by an issue and ensuring that the voices of those most affected are included in setting the agenda for change
- Thinking about how shared data will be disaggregated to reveal disparities by neighborhood, racial/ethnic groups, income, gender and other important characteristics
- Tailoring activities to benefit the broader population while also focusing on particular subsets of the population who face significant barriers
- Ensuring communications are accessible (in vehicle, language, etc.) and that those with lived experiences are active participants in co-creating the work
- **Building credibility** with the communities most affected by inequities and developing skills for the backbone to address disparities and authentically engage others
